

Hidalgo County Library System is a federated system of 13 Public Library members in Hidalgo County. HCLS strives to promote, coordinate and help provide full and FREE library services to all the residents of Hidalgo County.

### **Annual County Report 2020**

In this unprecedented period of COVID-19, Hidalgo County Library System member libraries have responded according to the safety levels ordered by our County Judge and our respective municipalities with the safety of our patrons and staff as the top priority. All HCLS libraries were closed at some point in March and April, with most exploring phased openings throughout May and into July. Some have since closed to the public again.

In an abundance of caution, all HCLS member libraries cancelled in-person programming in March of 2020. However, that did not prevent us from keeping our patrons engaged virtually! More than 2,000 participants registered for Summer Reading Program this year and took advantage of virtual programming for all ages. Many libraries delivered library materials curbside, even after reopening, to continue contactless service. All HCLS libraries extended the expiration dates of library cards for patrons to borrow physical and digital e-books. During this period, we saw a definite uptick in checkouts from the HCLS E-Branch, with a total of 38,424 checkouts of e-books, e-audiobooks, and e-magazines countywide since October 2019.



The ability to check out digital materials made a positive difference in the lives of those who observed the order to shelter at home or who wanted to minimize outbound visits.



To keep our visitors safe, all HCLS libraries are requiring facial coverings upon entering the library and throughout their stay. Some libraries removed or rearranged furniture and added visual cues to encourage social distancing. Still others installed sneeze guards at service desks to protect patrons and staff. Staff practice extensive health and safety measures to ensure that high-touch surfaces are cleaned and disinfected throughout the day. All libraries are alerted to any changes in guidelines from health and government agencies to remain in full compliance with local, state, and federal guidelines. Hand sanitizer is provided to all patrons and staff, as well as PPE. Patrons and staff are encouraged to

wash hands frequently, according to CDC guidelines. Libraries that offer computer lab and printing services sanitize surfaces between users.

All HCLS libraries are quarantining returned library materials before replacing those items on the shelf. The most current scientific recommendations we follow are from the Reopening Archives, Libraries, and Museums (REALM) Project, which specifies 96 hours for books and 168 hours for DVD, CD, and Audiobook materials to "rest" before being cleaned with an alcohol-based solution for re-shelving. 






The HCLS E-Library is an online collection of books, audio-books, and magazines, available to citizens of Hidalgo County for free, 24/7, on their phone or device of choice. The E-Library is a major initiative to promote literacy and demonstrate a commitment to providing literacy opportunities to residents of all ages and abilities, giving them the opportunity to download and read books anywhere they can access the Internet.

Since its launch in August 2017, usage has skyrocketed. Checkouts increased by 23% and registered users increased by 65% since 2019, with an average of 100 new registered users per quarter. HCLS Libraries continue to promote the E-Library through social media, flyers, outreach events, and in-house recommendation.
